Richard Kelley Master of Wine Director, Dreyfus Ashby The wines of South Africa

It is always a privilege to be able to welcome a Master of Wine to present to us at the Whitewater Valley Wine Society.

This month we welcome Richard Kelley, MW, who is Director of fine wine importers Dreyfus Ashby.

The company can trace its roots back to 1936 and Richard took over the helm in 2014. They specialise in seeking out and bringing new winemaking talent to the market. They pioneer the unknown and champion the unfashionable.

Dreyfus Ashby has a focus on South Africa and it is the wines from this country which Richard will present to us. There are some fantastic, innovative winemakers making excellent wine in South Africa. So it's no surprise that this is a region which is very popular with our members.

The evening's tasting will include both white and red wines.

More about Richard Kelley...



Richard became a Master of Wine in 1995. The subject for his dissertation was 'The importance of temperature in red wine making', which led him to visit South Africa for the first time, in search of a New World perspective. He fell in love with the country.

He soon met Rebekah, a fellow Brit, at a Champagne tasting in Cape Town and they were married at Boekenhoutskloof in October 1998.

Richard spent most of the next 10 years working in South Africa. He worked for Vinimark, the largest independent wine wholesaler in South Africa, developing international markets. He represented the interests of both Robertson Winery and a new and completely unknown wine farm in Franschhoek called Boekenhoutskloof.
